Day Drive to Hemja and hike to Ghachok: 01

Take our breakfast at your hotel in and drive (8:00 am) to to a starting point of hiking (Hemja) Milan

After the drive you walk through a terraced fields and classic mountain villages up from the river valley to Ghachok. Hike to Resort that will take you about 3 hours. Lunch will be serving at hotel. After refreshment take out to explore the village and enjoy the sun set. Later back to hotel and night rest.

Overnight in the Annapurna Moon village resort. (Breakfast - Lunch - Dinner)

Day Hike down to Hemja and drive back to Pokhara: 02

Wake up in the early morning (depends on sunrise time) to see the sunrise over the White Mountains of



Annapurna and

Dhaulagiri Ranges including fishtail.

Breakfast will be serving at your hotel and later we commence our trek along the way to Pokhara. We will have our lunch after we reach the beautiful city Pokhara. Our hiking will end.
